Students acted out a story about the grass on the other side being so much greener than the grass on our own side. Our year 9 students related this story to finding the "best school" or being the "best student". They discussed the reality of what the best school would look like and came up with a list of things it should have (you will be glad to know that our school has them!).



What they really discovered is that to be the best school, you also need to be the best student and that means developing affective skills. Providing an example of a time when they demonstrated perseverance in a learning situation helps students to recognize this conscious act and repeat it.

Primary School Sports Programme



On the 22nd of November, 11 boys from year 3-5 traveled to Thailand Phuket. This was historic for the Primary Schools Sports programme, no team had traveled outside of China.

The host school for this event was the British International School Phuket (BISP) and it was their 17th Annual event.

Over 1400 students, from 40 different international schools, from 10 different countries participated from as young as under 9 to Under 18 (both boys and girls).

The boys had only been training for 5 and a half weeks, with most taking advantage of the flexi-boarding program on offer at UISZ. They would train on a Monday and Wednesday evening and then stay and be part of the boarding programme on those evenings.

In the build-up to the tournament, we attended two 5v5 competitions in Guangzhou. The first was the Canton Cup and to be perfectly honest, this was just to asses how the boys would cope in a competitive situation. Results were not favorable, there were tears and no structure present in their play. The next was a tournament hosted by the British School Guangzhou and it was evident to see that the boys had progressed over the course of the 5 weeks, when they went on to clinch 2nd place, only losing the final match. The style of play and game understanding had improved immensely.

The remit prior to traveling to Phuket was always to enjoy the experience and try to stick to the football principles that we had tried to instill over the course of the 5 weeks. However, the standard of the team in Phuket was of the highest standard. Some of the schools attending had Sports Football Programmes that run all year, with their teams training 5 times a week.







Boarding Review
