Also on Wednesday MYP students held their Exhibition in the Theatre in the afternoon.









This week Y10 students were engrosed with revising for and sitting their e-mock exams. The photos below show the Humanities e-mock that took place on Monday afternoon.









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














Message from Ms Valentine






























Message from Ms. Dina (DP BiologyTeacher)

Our DP biologists this week delved into practicing IA lab skills by designing and conducting an experiment with catalase enzymes. Students were designing an experiment to test the effects of temperature and substrate concentration on activity of catalase enzymes. Catalase enzyme is one of the most widespread enzymes. It catalyzes the conversion of hydrogen peroxide, a toxic by-product of metabolism, into water and oxygen. By understanding the product of a reaction, students were challenged to find out what and how the dependent variable can be accurately measured. And they succeeded.
