

It was great to see the Primary school back in action this week, with the return of students from Years 4,5 and 6. The week began with some discussion about new rules to be followed as well as some changes to our learning schedules. Despite greater distance between the students, it has been a delight to see them reviving relationships with each other and enjoying being back in our learning community.













































In Mr Avdoos year 4 class, we are using comprehension strategies to build literal and inferred meaning to expand content knowledge, integrating and linking ideas and analysing and evaluating texts. We are doing this by exploring the features we may find in myths, specifically applying it to the myth of Romulus and Remus.

Features of a myth includes a setting in the distant past, mortal and immortal characters, including creatures or monsters, heroes and heroines; includes heavens or an underworld; provides an explanation for how something started and provides a long story with many different parts to the plot.

















As well as working on this great topic for literacy, we have also completed a series of test in order to evaluate what level the students are currently working at. These tests have been administered in Maths, English and developed ability tests. We will use the data from these tests to target areas of development for our students over the final weeks of semester 2. This will ensure they are ready and prepared for next academic year.
