








Meanwhile Year Five having been learning all about electricity in their current Unit of Inquiry. They have been constructing simple series electrical circuits. They have been identifying and naming its basic parts, including cells, wires, bulbs, switches and buzzers. Furthermore, the class investigated whether or not a lamp will light in a simple series circuit, based on whether or not the lamp is part of a complete loop with a battery and by visualising and testing circuits to see if the circuit is complete.


















#### **MYP**

In Miss Paola's year 7/8 Science class, students have been studying about Chemical Reactions and their applications in real-life. We focused on the potential dangers of mixing different cleaning products at home in the context of the COVID-19 pandemic. This past week, students spent time creating websites and blogs to inform our community about the Science behind these dangerous chemical reactions and to provide advice on what to do in case of exposure. Year 9s English class is continuing their inquiry-based learning on film and visual convention, and its connections with our daily usage language, such as movie reviews and critics. In order to reinforce such a concept, we had a hands-on activity in which the student matched movie posters and movie reviews and had to justify their decision. At the end of the session, students have to write a reflective piece in which they elicited the significance of visual language in our daily

The Y10 students are getting a preview of next year's IB DP Economics course by practicing a mock IA in Ms George's class. They are each carefully researching an issue, formulating a solution and then evaluating it. DP Econ teacher Mr Peebles has worked directly with them and their MYP Humanities teacher in designing the project to effectively model the DP Internal Assessment. It is also worth noting that a final MYP summative assessment in Humanities was NOT required this year because of the cancellation of the IB MYP exams. However, this group of Y10 students is very engaged, committed to success, and eager to get a jump start in the DP program, and they have chosen to take it anyway as it too was designed to model next year's Econ Paper 1/2 assessment. The Y10 students want to expand their academic lexicon and be as prepared for DP as possible. They are true stars!





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Y10 Chinese LL class is working on the traditional Chinese philosophy schools like Confucius, Legalism and Taoism. They have learnt some basic ideas of these philosophy schools by studying the proses written by the representatives of the schools. They studied how these representatives demonstrated their ideas and tried to convince others by their writing; they also explored the mutual influence of these ideas and the social circumstances, and they also tried to connect the ideas with some current global issues in the class discussions.































### **OUTRO**
